WWII Plane Crash Memorial Site

At 4:30 p.m. on the afternoon of August 19, 1943, a U.S. military C-49J, (#43-1971) on "Army ASTTF Transition training", was seen circling Island Pond in Hampstead, New Hampshire, at an altitude of between 1,000 and 1,500 feet with its wheels extended, when it suddenly went into a spin and crashed into this wooded area.

The United States Army Air Force plane departed from Logan AP, Boston and the weather at the time was broken to scattered clouds, 3-4000 feet, visibility unrestricted.
